North Conway, NH (NCON3) Monthly Weather Summary

June 2022

Summary

June 2022 featured near normal temperatures and drier than normal conditions. Temperatures struggled to hit the 70F mark on six days, with a few cool air outbreaks throughout the month. Heat and humidity peaked in the region late in the month, with a monthly maximum temperature of 92F reached on the afternoon of the 26th. Overnight, temperatures only dipped to 69F, setting a new daily high minimum temperature on for the 26th-27th.

Precipitation for the month largely fell during the first two weeks, with only paltry accumulations near month's end. In total, June ended nearly two inches below normal, following a drier than normal May. Precipitation for the year-to-date is 19.42 inches, which is 3.65 inches below normal. As of June 28th, the US Drought Monitor listed most of Carroll County and most of New Hampshire in D0 (abnormally dry) status.
